Giants Up Close

The 1:1 Giants of the Seas exhibition initiated and hosted by Greenpeace and the German Oceanographic Museum intends to raise the visitors' awareness for the ocean's colossuses by bringing them right into the museum. Come and see eight life-size models floating under the ceiling, including a 26-metre-long blue whale and a 15-metre-long sperm whale.

The Whale Spectacle

Shimmering blue light and mesmerizing whale songs will make you feel like being underwater swimming right next to one of those mighty marine creatures. Twice an hour, the exhibition turns into a multimedia spectacle full of light effects, sounds and images.

Meet Greenpeace

Several times a year, Greenpeace volunteers stop by and introduce their work on action days. Get to know them and learn more about environmental issues by join-in activities, information events, presentations, talks, films and much more. Children are invited to join in street theatre performances and handicraft activities. This year's action days topic: protection of the seas on our doorstep.

Visit the European Museum of the Year 2010 and experience a unique underwater journey through five large exhibitions and 50 aquaria devoted to the northern seas.

The World Ocean – Diversity of Life in the Seas

Submerge under the water surface and discover the Water Planet Earth! The exhibition displays marine biodiversity and unusual sea dwellers such as siphonophores, deepsea anglerfish and horseshoe crabs.

Baltic Sea-Exhibition

Who is the biggest carnivore of the Baltic Sea and why do codfish grunt? Find out in Europe's largest Baltic Sea exhibition featuring detailed lifelike habitats and fascinating exhibits. See the ocean's tiniest organisms and witness oversized clouds of plankton floating above your head!

Hint: Take a photo break at our "Seal Table" for children

Baltic Sea-Aquarium

Your underwater journey begins right in front of Stralsund harbour basin where eels, flounders and the common rudd meet. See pipefish and opossum shrimps hiding in the seagrass in column fish tanks. Even thornback rays and catsharks inhabit the Baltic Sea!

Hint: Get carried away in front of the herring pool

Exploration and Utilization of the Seas

Learn more about ocean research, global warming and overfishing. This exhibit visualizes the dimension of modern fishing nets and answers questions about seafood consumption.

North Sea-Aquarium

The aquarium tunnel takes you to the "Open Atlantic" tank. 2.6 million litres of water provide space for schools of fish, rays and our sand tiger shark "Niki".

Hint: Show feedings on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 11am

Penguins and Children's Sea

Our Humboldt penguins live on the museum's roof terrace. Observe these agile swimmers doing their rounds underwater.

Hint: Discover our new Children's Sea

1:1 Giants of the Seas

Unique in the world! Breathtaking life-size models of whales and other giants of the sea float 20 metres high over your head, including a 26-metre-long blue whale, a humpback whale female and her calf and an ocean sunfish.
